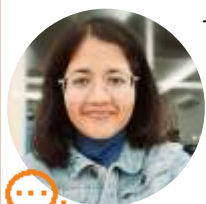

And we will always focus on being the BEST we can be!



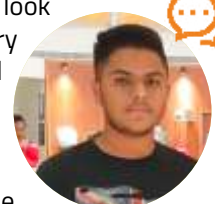
It's time to share a little of themselves.

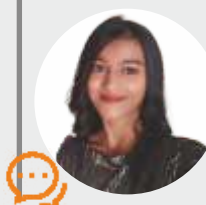

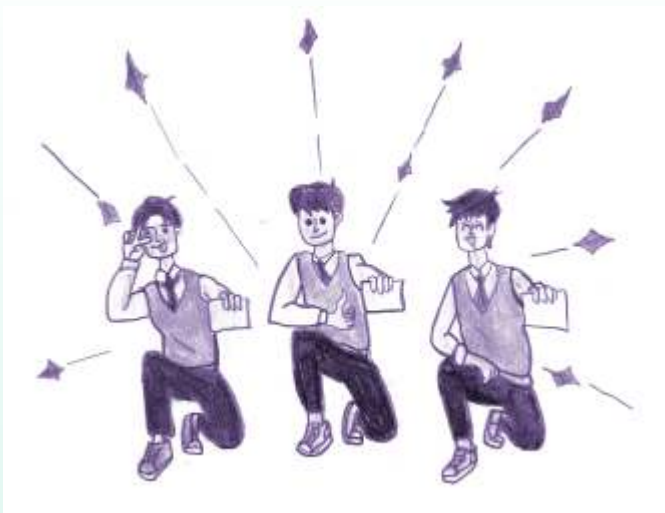

All about OpenAI for School students

AI technology is a trend today which is designed to enhance our life. It is nothing but a simulation of human intelligence into machines to do things that we would normally rely on humans beings.

ChatGPT is a chatbot developed by OpenAI and launched in November 2022. It's made by OpenAI, well-known for having developed the text-to-image generator DALL-E, and it's currently available for anyone to try out for free. Few pros and cons of ChatGPT concerning students are listed as under.



Pros

Students can access ChatGPT at any time of the day or night, which means they can get help with their studies even outside of school hours. ChatGPT can generate responses to student queries quickly, so that students can get the help they need promptly and also personalized responses based on their individual needs, which can help them improve their learning outcomes. It can generate responses to student queries quickly in multiple languages sought by them. The students can get the help they need promptly and can access a vast amount of information and answers to a wide range of questions related to their studies.

Cons

As ChatGPT is completely based on data provided, its responses are limited to the data it has been trained on, which means it may not be able to provide accurate or complete answers to all student queries. ChatGPT cannot understand emotions or provide empathy, and it may not be able to provide the support that some students need when they are struggling with their studies because it is an OpenAI source. It can be a source of distraction for students who may be tempted to use it for non-academic purposes. Students may become over-reliant on ChatGPT for answers to their questions, which can hinder their critical thinking skills and ability to problem-solve.

As with any technology that handles student data, there is always a risk of security breaches or unauthorized access to student information. It is important to ensure that appropriate security measures are in place to protect student data.

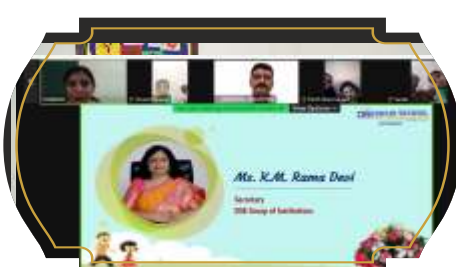

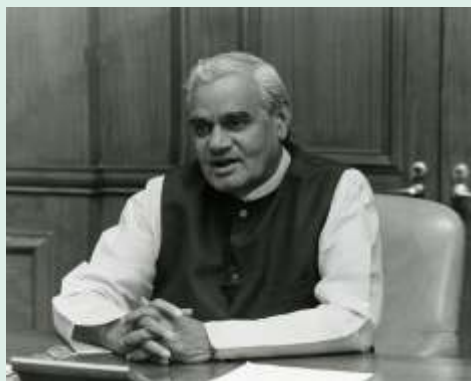

MY JOURNEY AT DSE



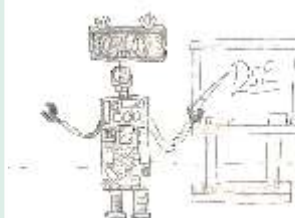

DSE feels that the mental health of every child is unique and each one of them has his/her own world of imagination. The primary motive behind counselling at DSE is to address the emotional, social, and behavioral needs of the students. And to create a seamless and friendly environment to help each one of them with different approaches. Let's get to know from our School Counsellor about the positive aspects of counselling.

What is the most creative and innovative counselling technique you have used so far?

Empty chair technique (from Gestalt Theory) for managing anger and working with low self-esteem.

Empty chair technique



How would you handle an irate parent?

- Greet them with a smile.
- Persuade them that I have the patience to listen and understand.
- Allow them to speak out (concerns).
- Make sure not to give weird expressions (rather prefer to stay calm)
- Convincing them that I am empathetic towards their situation.
- Try to verify their problems one by one.
- Give clarity about their expectations vs reality.
- Assuring their child's betterment and safety.
- Regular follow-up.



How would you handle a student having attendance problems?

- Finding out the problem for absenteeism from the parent/ guardian
- Connect with HRTs, coordinators, and parents in the completion of school work.
- Motivating the student by assigning some responsibility in the class.
- Giving some relaxation time in the initial days after every period to motivate his/her presence in the school.
- Frequently meeting the child and assuring that I am around, in case of any trouble.
- Psycho-educating the entire class to have a better approach towards that child.
- Regular follow-up.

What is DSE's strength and weakness?

The strength of DSE is the dedicated faculty and the efforts put in by them and the management in constantly improvising the curriculum to meet the requirements of every child.

There is always a scope for betterment in everything that we do and I don't consider it a weakness.

What experiences have you had in working with special education students?

- My experience as a special educator has transformed me into a solution-finder and made me elevate my patience levels.
- It made me a great listener and taught me to be empathetic.
- It helped me to document every single detail and improved my curiosity to know new things.
- It also helped me to manage my time and stick to deadlines.
- It taught me to be more qualitative.

Tell us about a successful (satisfying) case that you have handled. And, one that was not so successful.

Most satisfying case.

I have handled many students with a specific learning difficulty (SLD) out of which the most satisfying case was that of a child who started taking classes when she was in Grade 3. A pure case of SLD with difficulty in writing, reading, spelling errors, mirroring, and very scared of books. It was fun working with her and by the time she entered grade 5, all her limitations were ruled out and she started enjoying reading and even wrote creative stories with beautiful messages.

Unsuccessful ones.

When I handled cases of behavioral discrepancies then I felt a little dissatisfied as there wasn't a complete change in the behaviour and there is always a chance that the undesirable behaviour would revert back.

Post-pandemic has seen an increase in behavioral issues in students due to extensive internet usage, gaming, and excessive mobile use. Suggest a few tips to curb this problem.

- Turn off the notifications
- Setting time limits for usage
- Switching off everyone's gadgets after a particular time every day. (can use a landline for emergencies)
- Try to divert the temptation to check the messages by reading some book or cooking or gardening.
- Charge the gadgets in other rooms to avoid bedtime browsing
- Remove social media apps.
- Take a walk out and try to make new friends.
- Avoid all those things which make you anxious like checking others' profiles, reels, shots, online gaming points, etc.
- Develop some hobby
- Engage in some social service activities

Students these days overuse Facebook, Instagram, and other social media. Suggest some ways to come out of it. My only answer is ...

No amount of money or success can take the place of time spent with your family. It's all in your hands.

Think twice before you touch your phone.

Act wise when you use your phone when required.

Any message to our parents who hardly spend time with their children due to their busy schedules.

- Create a schedule (for work and breakouts)
- Re-evaluate your expectations (balancing and adjusting expectations)
- Be honest while fulfilling promises.
- Create work-life balance.
- Prepare one night before and have easier mornings.
- Stop comparing, (even) with siblings.
- Do not mock the children for everything they do.
- Respect their opinion and space.
- Have a family dinner time free from gadgets.

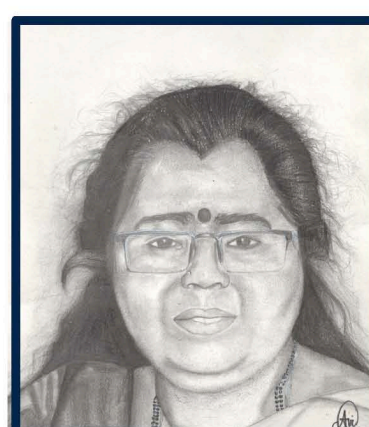
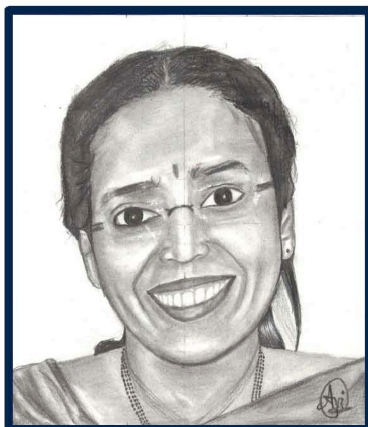
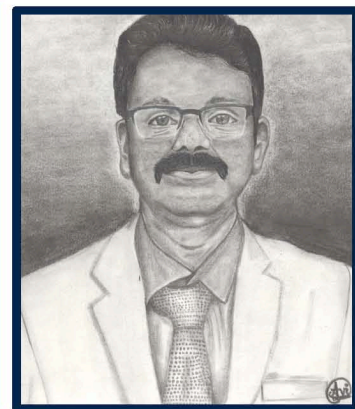
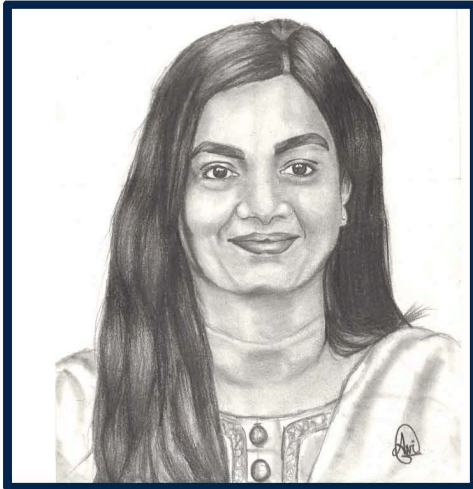
TURNING HIS HAND TO PORTRAY
